The communications between the Association and the Junior League were unsurpassed. John Quinn, as always, took a keen interest in the activities of the Association and the on-field performance of our members.

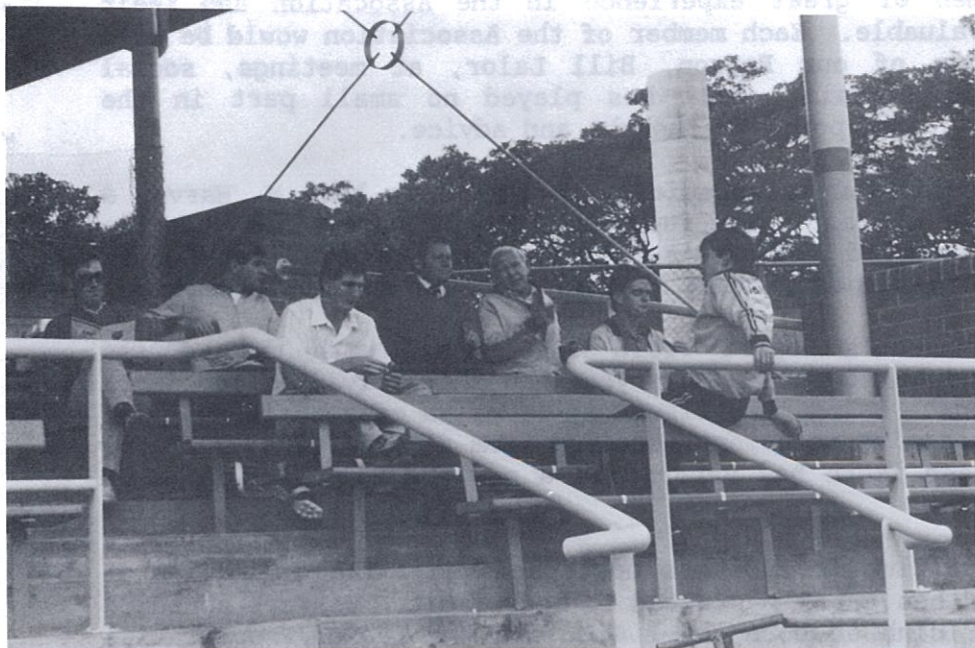

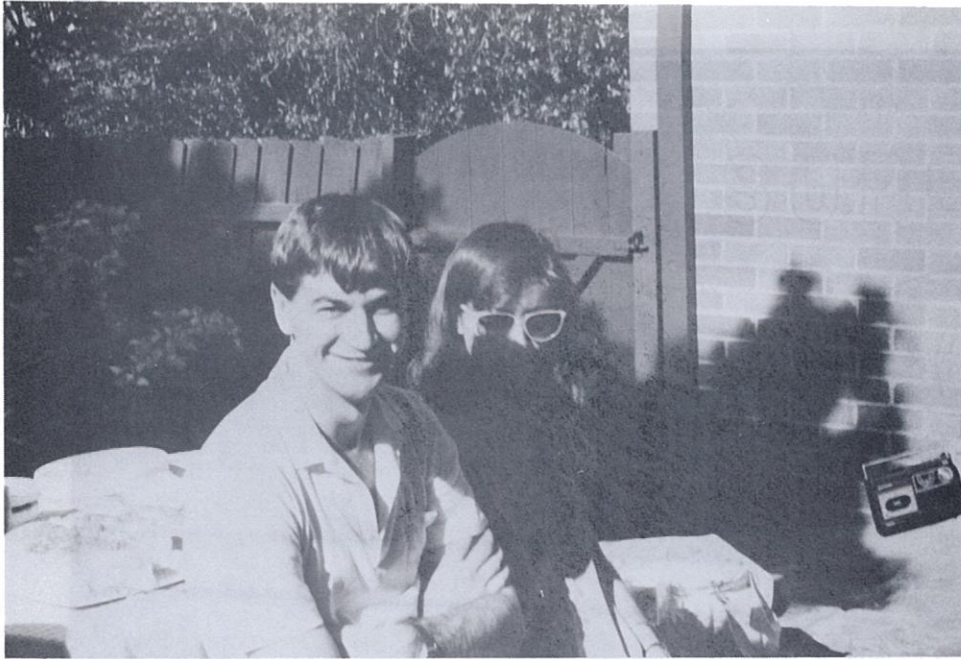

It is also with regret that we recorded the passing of our Life Member, John Walker.

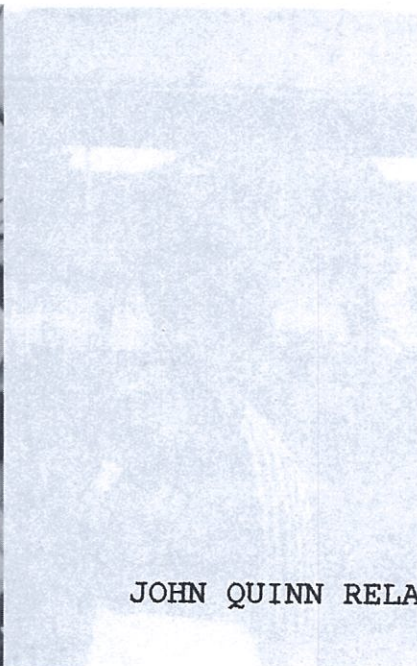
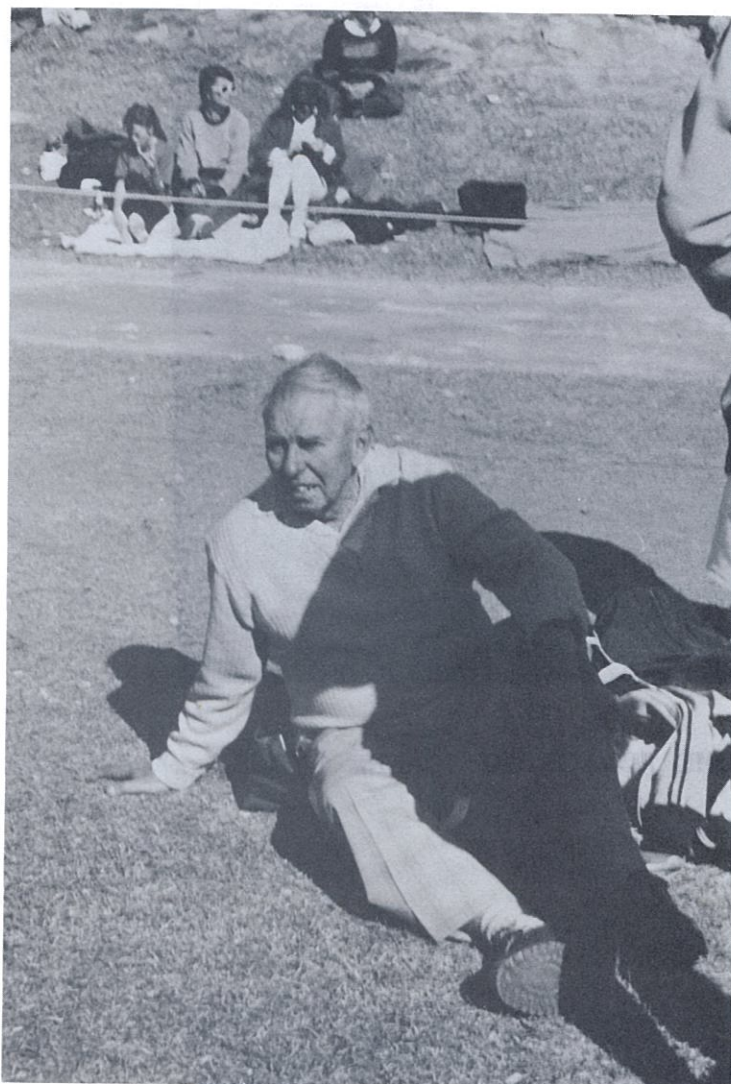

COACHING DIRECTORS REPORT

Fellow Members,

It is with pleasure that we furnish this report.

At the beginning of the 1986 season our members were very low. This flared a great burden on the active referees. As a result the standard of touch judging, whilst understandable slipped somewhat due to the increased work load.

A decision was taken that if we were going to lift the standard to more referees were needed, a campaign was started in the local schools with the result that we recruited 10 new referees into our ranks with a further 12 waiting to be examined.

This will make life a lot easier for our more senior referees and should see them only doing a minimal number of games before their A grade centre, not 5 or 6.

A new idea was tried in that active referees went along to various members homes for a video and a lecture on various points of the game and also to discuss any problems they were having in their own game.

This year saw the beginning of off season training on a regular basis. With a program set in which some time is set aside for fitness and the remainder on touch judging and rule interpretation. So far the attendance has been very encouraging with 14 to 20 referees attending. The sessions are held for 1 hour on a fortnightly basis alternating between Tunks Park and Asquith Boys High. We would like to see this kept up during the season, as it would be a great benefit to all.

During 1987, we will be moving into the video age with the use of equipment lent to the association by Hayden Harvey and Team. The importance for referees to see themselves as others do is of great benefit and can only teach referees where they can improve their game, as those who have had this opportunity would verify.

We would like to take this opportunity to congratulate all members who were appointed to Grand Finals. Your efforts proved to a lot of people that with a reduced work load, we can do the job required in a very professional manner.

Finally, our thanks go to Colin and John for their assistance during the year and we wish every member and their families a Happy Christmas and New Year and we look forward to 1987 with our new members.

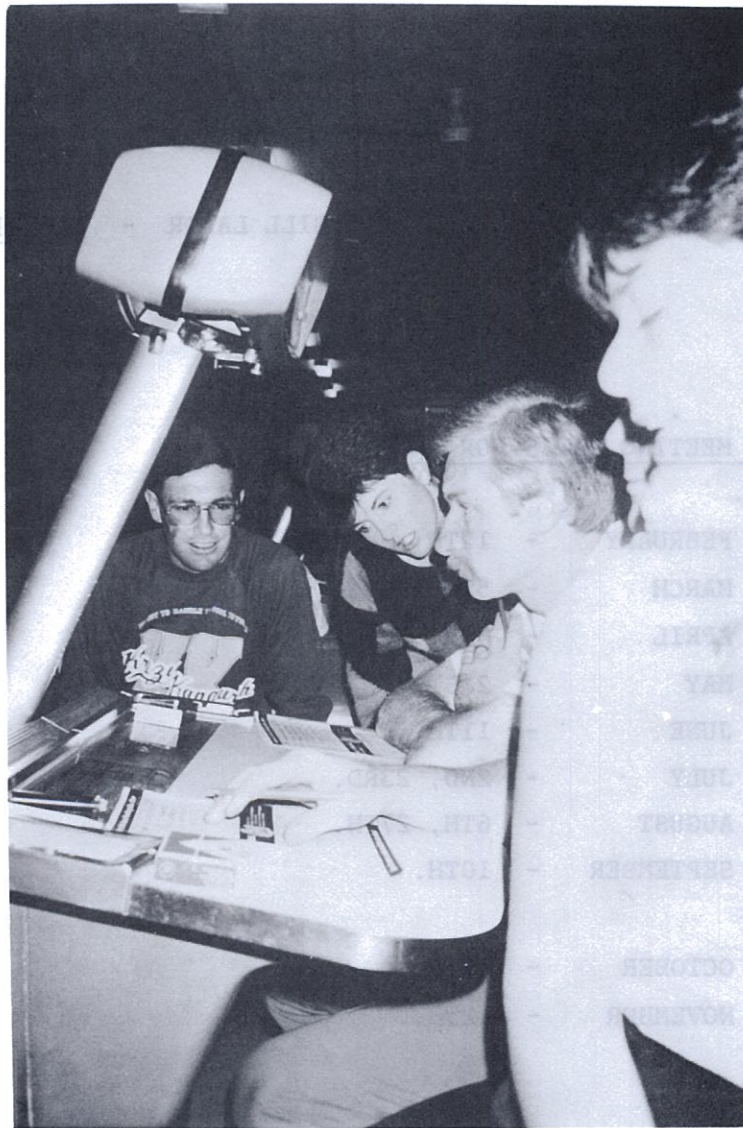
