PRESIDENT'S REPORT

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Fellow members.

It gives me great pleasure to present to you, the 1990 Annual Report and Balance Sheet, the first report for our Association as an incorporated body.

Season 1990 saw a great strain placed on the resources of the Association. We started the year by losing a couple of experienced members, the most notable being Bill Grech and David Smitheram who both moved to South Sydney as this Association was more convenient to where they live. The holes left by their departure had to be filled by our existing members and we were fortunate that our Juniors helped out on Sundays to ease the burden.

The year also started with the shadow of the Crows Nest Club Appeal still hanging over our heads. As this Club sought legal council at the hearing (in the form of a barrister), we were forced to do likewise. Through our Head Body and in particular, Kevin Roberts, we engaged the services of solicitor Jim Hall. Jim proved to be a valuable acquisition and his advice and assistance to the three members and the Association was This whole episode was of great concern to the Committee and it placed a great deal of unwarranted strain on the people involved. Martin Ryan, David Smitheram and Renato Iemma handled the difficult situation very well. Martin, in particular, was put under some very intense cross-examination from the Crows Nest barrister and he came through it with flying colours. Congratulations go to all three on the manner in which they conducted themselves during the hearings. A special vote of thanks also goes to Kevin Roberts for his assistance.

In the last two Annual Reports, the problem of abuse was mentioned. Needless to say, it raised its ugly head again but this year it was worse than ever. It even got so bad that a one stage during the season, two members retired over the abuse they and their families received at one ground. Fortunately, these two men were not lost to us and they both returned to their duties the following week. It was at this stage that members felt that the Committee could be doing more to look after their interests. However, the Committee found that they were not being informed of specific incidents and therefore they could not take the matters up with the Junior League. This led to a new report sheet being devised by our Assistant Secretary, Neville Warner. Called a match report, it was sent out with the appointments and the Referee of each game was to fill it in and return it to the Secretary. The overall response to this new report was good although a few members fell down in their responsibilities by not returning it. The form enabled the Committee to take matters directly and immediately to the Junior League and I feel that this made the Clubs more mindful of their responsibilities in protecting our members and controlling Crowd control got so bad towards the end of the season that the sale of alcohol was prohibited at the Senior Grand Final Day.

I must say that I was pleased overall with the way our members controlled themselves when they were confronted with a potentially dangerous situation. Three in particular spring to mind and they are Stephen Greig, Renato Iemma and Anthony Fillbrook. All three filed reports which were sent to the appropriate bodies and resulted in apologies being received from the respective Clubs or School. Well done gentlemen!

Not all the news this year was grim. In the following reports you will read of the achievements that our members attained this year at Grade, Junior Reps and Junior League level. To all of our members who gained a special appointment during the year, congratulations. Every member of the Association is proud of you. To those who didn't, keep trying and the rewards will come.

Another pleasing aspect of the season (or really off season) was the formation of a Touch Football team to play in the Hornsby Competition. Under the guidance of Pat Guilbert, our team has performed very well and at the moment, they are well placed for a Semi-Final position. Keep up the good work team.







JUNIOR LEAGUE REPORT

As in 1989, the 1990 season started with what now appears to be the obligatory wet weather. Although it was not as bad as last year, there were number of games postponed which did cause a few problems later on in the season, especially with the Saturday competitions.

Unfortunately, there were three occasions this year when the Executive felt it was necessary to address the Junior League on the matter of Clubs protecting our members. By the third occasion, the message finally hit home. It must be stressed that not all of the Clubs needed reminding. The majority of them always look after our members and make sure that they can leave the field in safety. However, a couple of Clubs fell down in this area and we felt that they had to be reminded.

With a concerted effort in promotion by the Development Officer, which in turn was backed by the individual Clubs, we experienced an increase in teams for the Mini/Mod age groups for the first time in many years. This promotion proved to be so successful that a number of Clubs registered two and sometimes three teams per age group. It is hoped that this success can be repeated in 1991.

However, the same cannot be said for the older age groups and the Junior League actually lost teams in the Under 12 to Under 16 age groups. This necessitated a combined competition with teams from Manly Warringah. The joint competition venture proved to be a success despite a couple of minor hiccups. Not only are these joint competitions good for the players, they are also good for our members as the Referees who controlled these games gained valuable experience by controlling teams from outside the District. With each District still running it's own Finals series in each age group, our members were still able to achieve a Grand Final appointment, something that had not been possible in the past when these joint ventures had been arranged.

The three Grand Final days were blessed with good weather and they proved to be most enjoyable days with close and exciting football being applicable to most age groups. Our congratulations go to all premiership winning teams and clubs.

Already, there have been some major changes in the make-up of the Junior League for 1991. The District Club has appointed a part-time Junior League Administrator/Coaching Director in Mick Woods to take some of the work load off the Board of Management. This is obviously a step in the right direction and it should see the Junior League become a more professional body. As well, the District Club has appointed Grade Players as two additional full-time and three part-time Development Officers. Hopefully these appointments will see the number of Junior League players and teams increase.

Malcolm Woodcock's tenure as President of the Junior League has ended as he did not seek reelection at their Annual Meeting. The new President is Brian Marsden. Both John Quinn and Jim Brannigan remain as Treasurer and Secretary. We thank the Board of Management for their help and support and we look forward to working with you in 1991.






SPONSORSHIP REPORT




