5. Adoption of the Minutes of Previous Annual General Meeting

Moved taken as read by Mr Geoff McManus, seconded Mr Minnett. Motion carried. No business arising from the minutes.

6. Correspondence

7. Presentation of the Annual Report and Financial Accounts

District grew by 20%, mostly female players in the league tag competition. Aim to have the girls playing tackle rugby league at some point. Numbers fell for under 13s and older – retention considered priority.

Suggested by Col Jones that we move a motion to congratulate the Junior League on their growth, seconded Brian Barry. Carried.

Brian Barry spoke briefly about the merger between the NSWRLRA and CRLRA. Merger passed 96 to 4. Noted that every referee benefits by the merger and that country referees will now have the chance to come down to Sydney for trials and to be reviewed for possible selection for representative squads, etc.

Mr Betts asked if the CRLRA had postponed their decision on the merger until February 2022. Noted that the CRLRA wanted to spend what was in their account before the merger.

Michael Quailey wished all members a safe offseason and a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

Meeting declared closed at 19:54.

6) Chairman's Report

Fellow Members,

Finally, we were able to wipe away the frustrations of the past two seasons, not only with a full year on the field but the celebration of our 100th Anniversary with a wonderful dinner in October.

I would like to thank the 100th Anniversary Committee for their diligence and planning of the function. A lot of hard work and long hours went into the function to make it the success it was. Thank you all.

One thing we leaned while planning for the evening and our history book was that we are older than 100 years. Records, not previously available to us, show that the Association was formed on April 9, 1913, at a meeting held at the Union Hotel in North Sydney. This establishment still exists today, sitting on the corner of the Pacific Highway and West Street.

This new information makes us, North Sydney Rugby League Referees' Association, the first District Referees' Association to be formed and the oldest Referees' Association in Metropolitan Sydney after the NSWRL Referees' Association which was formed in 1908.

We do not intend to celebrate our 110th Anniversary in 2023 in the manner we celebrated our 100th this year, but we are looking to have a dinner at the Union Hotel which will be a low-key affair. But just wait for 120th!

Our Junior League continues to expand and this, of course, places greater demands on our Association. With some Saturdays stretching on into the early evenings, we were able to negotiate a time and a half payment for any match that was scheduled to finish after 5:00pm. While this did help to some degree with availability, our members feel that they would rather be spending Saturday evenings with family and friends.

I can report that to ease the pressure on Saturdays, the NSWRL is considering moving Under 16s Tag and Under 15s Tackle to Sundays. While this will not doubt help with Saturdays, it may cause availability issues for Sunday Footy.

The major problem for 2022 was the weather. We lost the first two weeks of the season to washouts and, overall, 232 matches were lost to wet weather over the course of the season. That is the equivalent of nearly five weeks of footy.

We did eventually complete the season but with a booking confusion with North Sydney Oval, our Saturday Grand Finals were played at a new venue: Hills Grammar School at Kenthurst. While this is a good facility, we hope our biggest day of the season returns not only to the District, but to North Sydney Oval.

Welcome to North Sydney Referees and we hope that you enjoy yourselves.

All acquitted themselves well and have potential to progress.

Unfortunately, our six new recruits did not offset our losses and we ended up with 37 active members, two down on last year's 39.

To assist with the retention of active members, your Board undertook two initiatives.

The first was the implementation of two new Awards for Juniors, the Betts-Stone-Murray Award for most improved Junior Referee and the Michael Quailey Trophy for meritorious achievement by a Junior Member.

The second was commencing a Development Squad. The aim of this squad was to assist referees move from their F1 to an F2 accreditations. The scope of the Squad will be broadened in 2023 with the aim to not only help them gain their F2, but to also develop these Referees up to standard suitable for selection in the NSWRL Junior Development/Rep Squad, and to work with them through their senior High School years so they are not lost to the game. Policy Guidelines are currently being worked on and will be available in time for next season.

Wayne spent countless hours poring over old records and minutes to compile the member list that appeared in our centennial book. Now, each member has a number in the order of joining. It should be noted that this list is not definitive at this time as further research may unearth new members, especially in our early years. Also, Wayne finally received his Life Membership Blazer after a two year wait.

North Sydney Leagues Club continues to support Rugby League in the District and we thank you for your support.

7) Executive Officer's Report

Mr Chairman, my fellow Board members and fellow members,

To all of our 746 past and present members, 39 life members and all those who have supported our Association over that time, I say a big thank you! It is your ongoing efforts and support which make our Association what it is and our achievements over those years are really your achievements. Once again it is my great honour and pleasure to have co-authored this report.

2022 was a season which will be remembered for many reasons, most of those I'm pleased to say were positive. We finally enjoyed a season without the dreaded Covid-19 lockdown playing a part, albeit, the climatic conditions might have been considerably friendlier, with one of the wettest seasons in our time as an Association and one which certainly tested the patience (and not to mention the footing) of many a referee. 8) Director of Finance Report

It was my pleasure to serve as the Director of Finance in what was our 100th season. It was an eventful year for our Association; we had our first full season in three years, we had all of our celebration to mark the significant milestone we achieved this year as well as all the regular going on that a football season entails.

We launched our 100th Season with a small function at Asquith Leagues club. It was the first time that our members had been able to gather socially without any restrictions for some time. It was a very successfully evening and I would like to thank Ilana for organizing a wonderful evening. Our celebration continued at the grand finals of the Conference Competition. Where, after two exciting match members were able to watch our living legend Brian Barry perform a VIP kick, we were then able to watch the mighty Bear play. The final part of our celebrations was our Presentation evening. A fitting tribute to all the hard work put into our Association by the volunteers new and old. I would like to thank the members of the committee for their help in such an amazing evening.

This year bought with it more growth in the Junior league. Which in turn led to more growth in our match payments. Our members officiated in a huge number of matches. This was despite a very wet winter that washed out nearly a quarter of the scheduled games. Aside from match payments, our income is supported by generous sponsorship from our Major Sponsor Raine and Horne Hornsby, as well as from MPM Charted Accountants. I would like to thank them for their continued support. Their contribution allows the Association to subsidise our member gear which greatly reduced the cost of officiating, meaning members can retain more of the hard-earned match payments.

The final substantial aspect of our revenue this reason came in the form of grants from NSWRLRA. They continued to provide the administration grant, which is able to cover the cost of running the association. In addition to the administration grant they provided a grant to cover coaching and development grant. This year the process change. In previous years the grant was a paid and was up to us how to spend it. This year we were required to submit invoices that were reimbursed. NSWRLRA also made a contribution to the publishing cost our 100th season book, for which we are very grateful.

In summary, the Association made a net loss of \$4,750.54. This was expected as the Board anticipated that we would spend big celebrating our 100th season. The Association is still in a strong position and maintains a strong balance sheet.

This leaves me to thank my fellow board members. It's as been a pleasure to work with you all this season.

12) Junior League Report

Season 2022 was the first unbroken season we have had in three years. Gosh it was good to get almost an entire season of football. If it hadn't been for all the rain washing out the entire month of April, we would have completed a full season.

Once again the growth in the district was commendable. The fastest growing area of the game is without a doubt the League Tag version of the game. The biggest issue the Junior League has currently, is the amount of green space available for our use in the area.

This has meant that over the last few seasons, we have had very long days, starting at 8am on Saturday's and not finishing until 8pm on some weekends. The workload that everyone has had this year hasn't gone unnoticed.

The Junior League is looking hard at options of how to alleviate some of that pressure on the green spaces on Saturdays. Vale Bill Lalor – Life Member 29



On the 20th of November, we were all saddened to learn of the passing of Bill Lalor, aged 93.

Since 1952, Bill has made an enormous contribution to our Association and its members. With a smile and a twinkle in his eye, he gave valuable sage advice and he provided a guiding hand to me through personal difficulties but also through the early years after I was elected President.

William Brian Lalor was born on Thursday 30th May 1929, at home (quite a common occurrence in those days) in Willoughby, the youngest of two sons to Richard and Harriet Lalor.

He walked across the Harbour Bridge on the day it was opened and then attended Willoughby Public School and later Artarmon Primary School for grades 5 and 6. He then attended North Sydney Technical College.

Growing up, Bill started following the North Sydney Bears and became an ardent supporter. He also took up playing, joining his local club Willoughby playing Junior League. A slightly built lad, he was put out on the wing and despite this, would often get injured. This seemed to happen often when his girlfriend Val brought her mum along to watch him play. Deciding that getting injured was not much fun, he took up the whistle and joined North Sydney Referees in 1952. He currently has Member Number 73.

1952 was also the year that Bill married Val on the 15th of November. They had first met in 1946 or 1947 and from that moment on, they never looked back. A daughter Marilynne arrived in 1954, then Jennifer in 1957, and a son Steven in 1959.

In September 1957, the family moved to the familiar address of 20 Warren Street, Ryde. That also meant that Bill left Norths Refs at that time for the next 18 years. If you ever visited Bill's home, he and Val made you feel so welcome that one was reluctant to leave, especially when the Scotch came out.

He returned in 1975 and remained with us for the next 47 years until his passing.

Bill's other great sporting love was golf. He joined North Ryde Golf Club could be seen on many a weekend tackling the club's course. The Association recognised his talents and appointed him Captain of our Golf Team in 1993, a decision that bore immediate success as we defeated the highly fancied Canterbury Team in consecutive years. Bill relinquished captaincy of the team following 1998 but remained part of the team going forward.



He served as Patron of the Association for 21 years from 1985 to 2005. He also served as Assistant Secretary from 1955 to 1957, Auditor from 1976 to 1978 and Delegate to Head Body from 1955 to 1957. He also served on numerous committees.

Bill also served the Junior League as a Judiciary Panel Member for approximately 20 years.

On the field, he was appointed Touch Judge to the 1956 President's Cup Final and was the A Grade Grand Final Referee in 1955 and 1956, the D Grade Grand Finals in 1953 and 1954 and the B Grade in 1957.

But his major contribution was attending grounds and looking after and coaching referees. We all benefitted from his sage advice.

For his outstanding and contributions to the Association, he was awarded Life Membership in 1991, becoming our 29th Life Member.

His passing leaves a void that can never be filled. We can, however, try to emulate what he achieved. His dedication, commitment and contributions will never be forgotten.

To Jenn and Family, we extend our deepest and sincere condolences.
